## The History of Guy Fawkes



The British celebrate Bonfire Night every year on 5 November in the memory of a famous event in British history, the Gunpowder plot. On 5 November 1605, a group of Roman Catholics planned to blow up the House of Parliament while King James I was inside the building. However, the evening before, Guy Fawkes was caught in the cellars with gunpowder, and the plot was discovered. He and Thomas Wintour were executed by hanging. Bonfire Night is also known as Guy Fawkes Night.

Originally, Bonfire Night was celebrated as a victory for Protestants over Catholics, but nowadays everyone enjoys this festival. Some children make a figure of a man made of old clothes stuffed with newspaper or straw to represent Guy Fawkes. The figure is then burned on top of a bonfire on Bonfire Night. Fireworks are also present during this celebration, but there are restrictions on the type of fireworks that can be used by the public. Some people hold private bonfire parties in their gardens, while others attend larger public events organized by councils or charities.

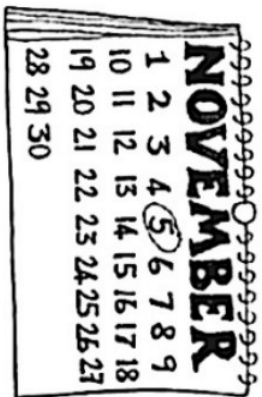

The 5<sup>th</sup> of November is an important festival in Britain. It's called "Bonfire Night".  
On this day people remember the year 1605.



In the evening the puppets are burnt on bonfires, people look at fireworks and eat jacket potatoes, sausages and toffee apples.



In November 1605, a catholic called Guy Fawkes and his friends try to kill the protestant King James I.



Every year, on November 5<sup>th</sup>, in England people commemorate Guy Fawkes. Children make puppets with old clothes and ask "a penny for the guy". The children use the money they collect to buy fireworks.



They want to blow up the House of Parliament with the king and his minister inside.



The soldiers found Guy Fawkes in the cellar; they took him to prison and executed him. So the king was safe and he ordered that people lighted bonfires and fireorks.



They put 36 bearels of gunpowder in the cellar of the building. But the king was informed about the plot and sent his soldiers to the cellar.

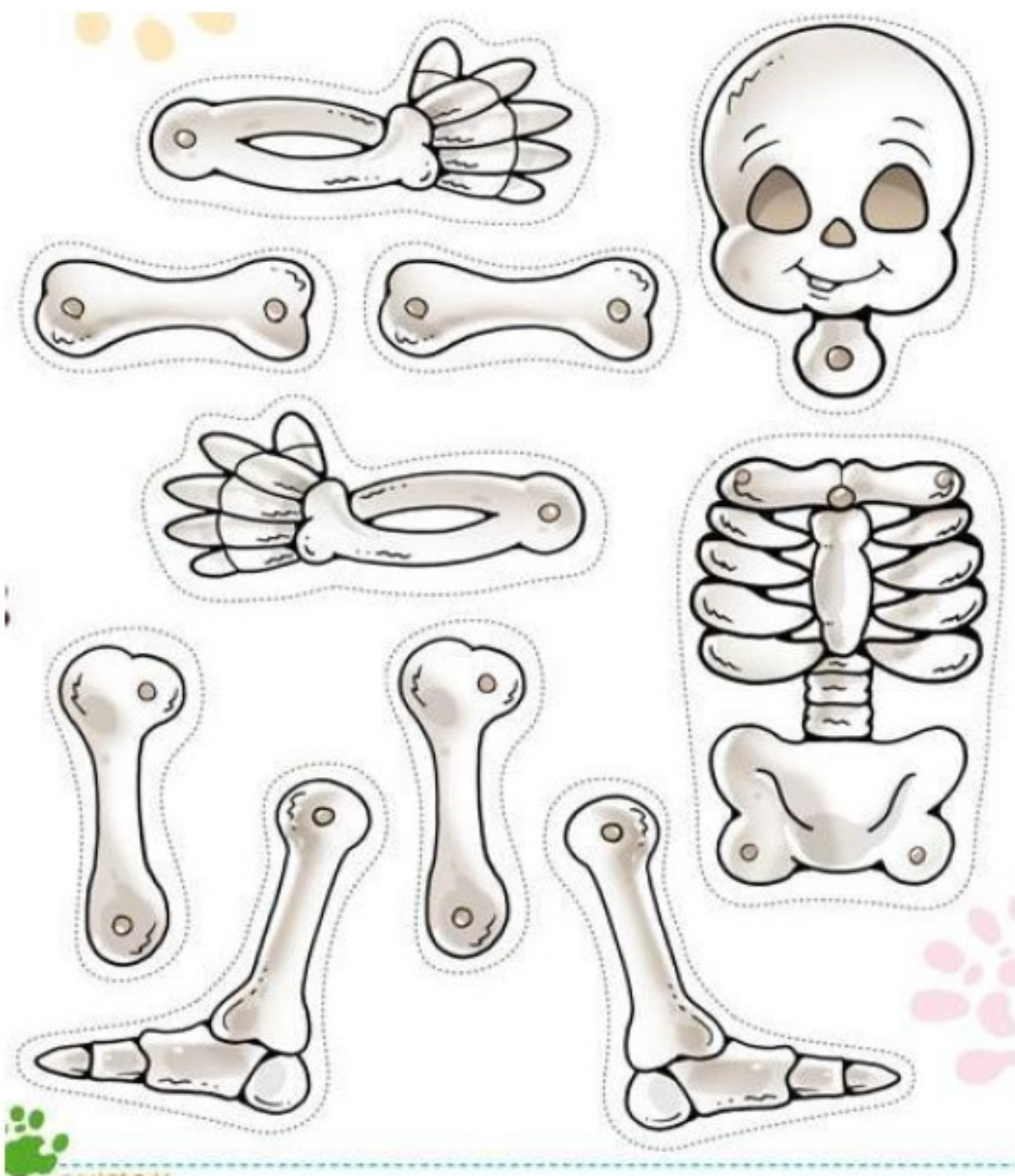
Halloween has Celtic origins. The Celtic life was in two parts: summer and winter. Summer was from May to the end of October, and winter was from November to the end of April. The ancient Celtic festivity Samhain celebrated the start of the year: the start of winter. It began on the evening of October 31 and continued until the next day.

Druids were Celtic soldiers. On October 31 they performed religious rituals and talked about future events. The Celts believed that ghosts, witches and evil spirits disappeared on the night of October 31. They believed that evil spirits entered the body of a person or animal. They wore frightening costumes and made loud parties to send them away.

The colours of Halloween — orange and black — are of Celtic origin, too. Orange was the colour of the sun, and black was the colour of soil and long nights. The Druids believed that black cats had special sense and could feel if spirits were near. So black cats have become symbols of Halloween.

The Romans invaded Great Britain in AD 43. After this invasion Samhain became a harvest festival. During the centuries, the Roman Catholic priests put Christian festivities in the place of pre-Christian festivities. In the eighth century the Church decided to call 1 November All Saints' Day. Another name for this day was Holly day. The evening of 31 October was All Hallows' Eve. This became Halloween.
